John 13:34-35: "A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must **love one another**. By this all men will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another". THE STORY (PARABLE) OF THE GOOD SAMARITAN (Luke 10:25-37)

Cast of Characters:

Robbers

Jewish Man going from Jerusalem to Jericho, who was robbed and badly beaten by robbers.

- 3 Men who had opportunity to help this Jewish man:
- 1) **Jewish Priest** a professional religious leader
- 2) **Jewish Levite** a lay religious leader/associate
- 3) Samaritan Samaritans were considered enemies of the Jews; Samaritans and Jews hated each other. Samaritans were considered inferior because they were of mixed Jewish and Gentile descent; there were also religious and political differences.

Luke 10:25: On one occasion an expert in the law stood up to test Jesus. "Teacher," he asked "what must I do to inherit eternal life?"

- 26: "What is written in the Law?" he replied. "How do you read it?"
- 27: He answered: "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind', and, 'Love your neighbor as yourself.'
- 28: "You have answered correctly," Jesus replied. "Do this and you will live."
- 29: But he wanted to justify himself, so he asked Jesus, "And who is my neighbor?"
- 30: In reply Jesus said: "A man was going down from Jerusalem to Jericho, when he fell into the hands of robbers. They stripped him of his clothes, beat him and went away, leaving him half dead.
- 31: A priest happened to be going down the same road, and when he saw the man, he passed by on the other side.
- 32: So too, a Levite, when he came to the place and saw him, passed by on the other side.
- 33: But a Samaritan, as he traveled, came where the man was; and when he saw him, he took pity on him.
- 34: He went to him and bandaged his wounds, pouring on oil and wine. Then he put the man on his own donkey, took him to an inn and took care of him.

- 35: The next day he took out two silver coins, and gave them to the innkeeper. 'Look after him,' he said, 'and when I return, I will reimburse you for any extra expense you may have.'
- 36: Which of these three do you think was a neighbor to the man who fell into the hands of robbers?"
- 37: The expert in the law replied, "The one who had mercy on him." Jesus told him, "Go and do likewise."

John 17:20-23 "My prayer is not for them alone. I pray also for those who will believe in me through their message, that **all of them may be one**, Father, just as you are in me and I am in you. May they also be in us so that the world may believe that you have sent me. I have given them the glory that you gave me, that they may be one as we are one: I in them and you in me. May they be brought to **complete unity** *to let the world know that you sent me and have loved them even as you have loved me*".

Our position in Christ: God's dearly loved spiritual children (Colossians 3:12).

Our purposes in Christ: Glorify God, by loving God and loving others and by making disciples (I Corinthians 10:31; Matthew 22:34-40, 28:18-20).

Our common Core Values:

Six Individual values: a Commitment to Loving God; a Commitment to Loving People; a Commitment to Personal Transformation (becoming more like Jesus); a Commitment to Humble Servant-hood; a Commitment to Integrity; and a commitment to Partnership.

Six corporate values: a Commitment to Biblical Authority and Truth; a Commitment to Reaching People for Jesus; a Commitment to Discipleship and Ministry; a Commitment to Prayer and Worship; a Commitment to Biblical Community; and a Commitment to Grace.

Refer to Acts 2:42-47

- a) Jesus said "... it is not the healthy who need a doctor, but the sick. I have not come to call the righteous, but sinners" (Mark 2:13-17; Matthew 9:9-13; Luke 5:27-32).
- b) Jesus was and is the friend of sinners (Luke 15:1-2; Mat 9:9-13; Mark 2:15-17; Luke 5:27-32). All of heaven rejoices when ONE sinner repents and is saved ... and so should we! (Luke 15:10).
- c) "We should do everything we can short of sinning to reach people for Jesus" (quote from Haddon Robinson, past President of Denver Seminary)! We should remove unnecessary obstacles when reaching out to non-Christians (I Corinthians 9:19-23, 10:31-11:1, 14:23-24).

Acts 1:8 "But you will receive **power** when the **Holy Spirit** comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth".

c) Power of Love

- **d) Power of Prayer** (refer to Matthew 7:7-12; Luke 11:1-15)
- e) Power of the Word

God's word is "living and active" and will achieve it's purposes (Hebrews 4:12-13; Isaiah 55:10-11). God's word can equip us for good works (II Timothy 3:16-17). Learning AND applying the word results in great spiritual growth, fruitfulness and blessing (Mark 4:3-20; Luke 8:15, 19-21, 11:28).
