The Golden Rule is inclusive ("in everything"), proactive and action oriented ("do"), positive ("do to others
what you would have them do to you"), and it's personal ("you").
Characteristics of Love from I Corinthians 13
Great giftedness and great works without love have minimal value (verses 1-3)
orem syremiess and great works without tove have minimul value (verses 1-3)
What I are is and what I are is not (verses 1 9).
What Love is and what Love is not (verses 4-8):

Love is patient ... is kind

Love does not envy ... does not boast ... is not proud not rude ... not self-seeking ... not easily angered

Love keeps no record of wrongs

Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth

Love always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres

Love never fails

Love is supreme (verse 13)

Other biblical teachings:
